George McAffer, OMM

"A Legacy of Leadership, Service, and Compassion"

The Volunteer Cancer Drivers Society named Colonel (ret'd) George McAffer Honorary Life Member in recognition of his extraordinary contributions, leadership and unwavering commitment to the VCDS mission.

From piloting fighter jets during the Berlin Crisis to walking a young woman to safety on a late-night crisis call, George McAffer has lived a life defined by courage, compassion and service. A natural leader, George has brought the same dedication to his volunteer work as he did to his 30-year career in the Royal Canadian Air Force and his later ventures in government and private business.

In 2016, George became a director of the newly formed Volunteer Cancer Drivers Society to ensure cancer patients in Surrey, Langley, Abbotsford, Mission, Tri Cities and North Vancouver would have access to transportation to treatment. George was instrumental in building the VCDS from a grassroots idea into a professional, volunteer-driven organization. He was instrumental in the creation of Society bylaws, the development of key charitable funding sources, leading the expansion of the VCDS services, and establishing the policies and procedures that continue to shape the organization today.

As a volunteer driver, George has been a steady presence and a source of comfort to patients and he fondly remembers the resilience of those he's driven and speaks with humility about the impact of simply being there: "It's a small thing for us-but it means everything to them."

When asked to summarize his George offers two words: "Pride. Satisfaction."

George's legacy is woven into the very fabric of VCDS and the VCDS team is delighted to recognize him as an Honorary Life Member for his visionary role in building and growing the Volunteer Cancer Drivers Society, and for his continued dedication to supporting cancer patients across our communities.


Distinguished Service Award


Dispatch and Driver Statistics

Volunteer Cancer Drivers Endowment Fund

The Society has set up a fund at the Vancouver Foundation known as the 'Volunteer Cancer Drivers Endowment Fund' to provide for the future sustainability of its operations. Income earned by the Fund is reinvested by the Foundation. Should the Society have a shortfall in funding in any year, it may apply to the Foundation for a grant from the fund. The market value of contributions and earnings reinvested to date was \$1,720,427 as of December 31, 2024.
